Opioid Fast Facts

- Some people will become addicted after taking opioids for only five days. The more days you take opioids, the greater your chance of addiction.
- Most people's pain level that would require something as strong as oxycodone only lasts one to two days.
- No family is immune to addiction issues.
- 80% of people that use heroin report starting with prescription drugs.
- The best time to plan for the safe use and disposal of opioids is before you take them.

 - Lortab[®], Lorcet[®], Norco[®], Vicodin[®], Tussionex[®] suspension, Tussicaps[®]
- **Hydromorphone products**
 - Dilaudid[®]
- **Meperidine products**
